Commission Update

Delta Conveyance Project: Commission staff met October 21 with Department of Water Resources Delta Conveyance Office (DCO) staff on the status of their Environmental Impact Report (EIR) studies for the Delta Conveyance Project (DCP). Soil investigations are continuing, but as noted below engineering is generally considered complete for the purpose of the environmental review. Analysis of potential impacts and measures to reduce or mitigate them are underway, and a public Draft EIR is still expected in April to May 2022. The next coordination meeting is set for December 9, 2021.

Commission staff also continue to monitor meetings of the Delta Conveyance Design and Construction Authority (DCA) Board and Stakeholder Engagement Committee (SEC). The September 22 SEC meeting was eventful, with a number of SEC members voicing growing frustration following a tense air quality impacts presentation. Several members have recently resigned from the SEC (including Restore the Delta's Barbara Barrigan-Parilla, announced at the meeting). At the meeting conclusion, DCA announced the intention to "sunset" the SEC after a final meeting in December, explaining that engineering is complete for the purpose of environmental review. A number of SEC members expressed the view that the SEC has been valuable as a means for engaging with the DCA, despite their frequent dissatisfaction with content and process.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) initiated the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 consultation on historic and cultural resources that will be required for the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) process. The October 21, 2021 meeting included participation by Commission and Delta counties staff as well as interested parties from the public. This initial meeting introduced the consultation process and discussed development of a Programmatic Agreement, which the Corps explained is the process they follow in the event they are not able to fully evaluate (and therefore avoid or mitigate) all

potential impacts to historic resources. The Corps does not itself collect data but relies on resource information provided by the applicant (DWR) and their consultant. The Commission has provided the Corps a preliminary narrative report on cultural resources in the conveyance project area compiled from numerous sources in our records as well as interviews with local experts. Staff will continue to encourage and gather input from local experts and plans to keep the interested public informed through an occasional newsletter.

Delta National Heritage Area: The Delta Heritage Forum was held online on November 3 with 79 registrants. Sessions included an update on the Delta National Heritage Area, a workshop on heritage adventures, a review of interpretation and interpretive themes in the Delta and Carquinez Strait, and a workshop on the management plan. Sessions are currently available for viewing through the Commission website. Commission staff, Point Heritage Development Consulting, and California State Parks staff met with the NHA Advisory Committee and three of the four task groups in September and October. The NHA Management Plan Advisory Committee will next meet on December 2.

Delta Leadership Program: The 5th edition of the Delta Leadership Program will commence on January 7, 2022 and conclude on April 22, 2022. Nominations are due by November 19, and we hope to convene a diverse group of approximately 20 emerging leaders from throughout the region. Chair Nottoli and Vice Chair Winn have agreed to review the nominations, and will be joined by Delta Regional Foundation President Mike Campbell.

Broadband in the Delta: Commission staff are continuing to work with public and non-profit partners to identify local needs and opportunities, in anticipation of future grant funding opportunities. The federal broadband grant results are expected to be announced by NTIA on November 15, 2021.

We are still encouraging Delta residents to use the California Public Utilities Commission CalSPEED application to validate internet download and upload speeds throughout the Delta. Data collected in part from these validations was instrumental for the grant application to identify areas that have inadequate capacity or adoption rates due to cost.

Delta Waterway Cleanup: The Delta Waterway Cleanup is part of California Coastal Cleanup Day and was held on Saturday, September 18, 2021. Commission staff organized and hosted three cleanup locations this year: the Broadrick Boat Ramp in Yolo County, Bethel Island in Contra Costa County, and the Tower Bridge/Riverfront Promenade in Sacramento County with nearly 90 volunteers attending. It is estimated that approximately 150 bags of trash were removed from these areas along our Delta waterways. Commission staff also promoted other cleanup locations in Solano and San Joaquin County sending in another dozen volunteers to support those efforts. Commission staff developed a new Delta Waterway Cleanup logo which

was printed on tubular bandanas (buffs) donated by Regional Sans and provided to volunteers as a gift for their efforts. Commission staff would like to give a special thank you to our partners and supporters: The City of West Sacramento, the Sacramento Picks It Up Group, DMB Community Life, Sacramento City Councilmember Katie Valenzuela and staff, Yolo County Supervisor Oscar Villegas and staff, Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery, Cache Creek Conservancy, City of Davis Public Works, Solano Resource Conservation District, San Joaquin County Public Works, and the California Coastal Commission.

Commission Land Use Comments: There were no land use comment letters prepared by Commission staff from September 9 through November 10, 2021.

Commission Staffing: The Commission is currently advertising to fill all three of its vacancies: Office Technician (to assist with front of office work, act as Clerk), Associate Governmental Program Analyst (to provide internal administrative, contract, and grant support), and Senior Environmental Planner (to lead land use review and other regional economic development efforts).
