Commission Update

Delta Conveyance Project: Commission staff attended the last meeting of the Delta Conveyance Design and Construction Authority (DCA) Board and Stakeholder Engagement Committee (SEC) on December 8. The SEC is being disbanded by the DCA since engineering is considered complete for the purpose of environmental review. Staff will continue to monitor the DCA meetings.

Commission staff continue to meet with Department of Water Resources Delta Conveyance Office (DCO) staff on the status of the Delta Conveyance Project (DCP) EIR preparation; the draft EIR is anticipated for release in April to May 2022, along the federal Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Staff also continue to engage on the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 consultation on historic and cultural resources.

Broadband in the Delta: Commission staff will continue to work with public and non-profit partners to identify local needs and opportunities, in anticipation of future grant funding opportunities. The NTIA announced in late November that federal broadband grant applications had overwhelmed the program and that applications were still in screening, with results likely in first quarter of 2022.

Delta National Heritage Area: Commission staff, Point Heritage Development Consulting, and California State Parks staff met with the NHA Advisory Committee on December 2. Agenda items included a discussion of the potential NHA heritage adventures and updates on the Delta Heritage Forum and the task groups. The NHA Management Plan Advisory Committee will meet next on February 3 and March 3. The four advisory task groups – Heritage Development & Tourism, Interpretive Planning, Organization, and Resource Stewardship – will meet in January and February.

Delta Leadership Program: The 6th cohort of the Delta Leadership Program convened on January 7 with a Zoom seminar. It is a diverse group of 13 emerging leaders from throughout the region. We will meet next on February 4 at the Port of Stockton and conclude the program on April 22. Commission members will be invited to meet our participants at a reception following the conclusion of the April 22 seminar, and the Program participants are anticipated to attend the May 19, 2022 Commission meeting to present their class projects.

Commission Staffing: Claire Cooey joined the Commission staff on January 10 as Associate Governmental Program Analyst to provide internal administrative, contract, and grant support. Claire comes to us from the California Department of Managed Health Care and is a Delta enthusiast. Morgan Matz has accepted an offer to join the Commission on January 20 as Office Technician to assist with front-of-office and Clerk duties. Kirsten Pringle will join the Commission staff on February 2 as Senior Environmental Planner to lead land use review and other regional economic development efforts. She currently works with Stantec (engineering and environmental consulting firm) and has a background with Delta work.
